

## GambleAware InfoHub resource inclusion criteria

Through the InfoHub, GambleAware provides downloads of open access articles, and abstracts with links to purchase those that require a fee. We have developed criteria to determine whether a resource should be included in the InfoHub. While GambleAware aims to include only items that satisfy the criteria set out below, it gives no guarantees as to their status. GambleAware does not endorse any of the items included in the InfoHub.

- **Peer-reviewed research:** gambling and problem gambling literature and resources that have been subject to peer review and are indexed within academic databases and/or Google Scholar;
- **GambleAware-funded research:** research that has been funded in part or whole by GambleAware, which has also been peer-reviewed;
- **Grey literature:** gambling and problem gambling literature and resources that are not peer-reviewed or controlled by commercial publishers. A resource will be included in the Grey Literature collection provided that:
  1. It discusses research into responsible gambling, the nature and causes of gambling-related harm and the effectiveness of treatments
  2. It has not been commercially published
  3. The Title, Author and Date of Creation can clearly be identified
  4. It presents an accurate or unbiased interpretation or analysis of legislation, policy or research
  5. The creator of the resource represents a trusted organisation or institution
  6. It is the complete and final version of the resource
  7. It is a written document, or if it is an audio/visual resource, it is accompanied by a written transcript
  8. Posting the resource will not violate copyright or intellectual property rights

Two further criteria are used to determine which resources are given priority during the curation process:

9. The resource is in English
10. The geographic scope of the resource is Great Britain. Priority is then given to British-focused resources followed by those with an international focus.
